The children will develop and explore their creative side through:

- Joining in with songs
- Beginning to mix colours
- Joining in with role play games and using resources available for props
- Building models using construction equipment
- Singing call-and-response songs, so that children can echo phrases of songs you sing
- Creating self-portraits and junk modelling
- Listening to and learning some Julia Donaldson songs
- Exploring sounds and how they can be changed
- Tapping out of simple rhythms
- Providing opportunities to work together to develop and realise creative ideas
