MATHEMATICS



Spring term 2021 Class 3

ENGLISH

This term we will be exploring a text by Jenny Nimmo. We will familiarise ourselves with the text structure

used in our text 'The Beasties', focussing on developing our narrative writing. We will then look at 'Fantastically great women who changed the world'. In this text we will look at using fronted adverbials in our writing.



SCIENCE

This term we will be learning about 'Animals including humans'. We will be exploring the different food groups. We will be investigating which nutrients we get from different foods and what we need to

survive. Alongside this, we will be exploring the human skeleton and how the human body moves.

COMPUTING

In Computing the children will be learning how to program using Scratch. By the end of the unit the children will have

gained an understanding of how to using linked blocks of instructions to program sprites and background to move and make sounds. The final outcome will be creating a simple piano..

In the first half of the term, the children will be looking at Levers and Linkages. They will learn how to design and make these so that they can create movement. The final

MUSIC In music the children will begin learning to play the glockenspiel. As part of this, they will learn to use beaters to play different musical notes. The class will learn to play a number of short pieces of music which they will perform to an audience. Alongside this, the children will listen to and reflect on Bangra music from India. Their musician focus will be Apna Sangeet.	In the second half of the term, the children will be looking at the structure of packaging. This will link to 3D shapes and they will have the opportunity to research the different shapes of packaging available and the nets they are made from. Alongside this, they will look at how graphics enhance design and their final outcome will be a box to contain a product.
PE This term our PE units are dance, tag rugby, gymnastics and netball. The children will develop their skills in each sport. We will have PE on a Monday and Thursday afternoon.	PSHE We will be using Jigsaw for PSHE. This term our topics are 'Dreams and Goals' and 'Healthy me'. We will be discussing and reflecting on our achievements and what we hope to achieve in the future. We will also discuss how to stay healthy and what being healthy means.
MFL Our French units this term are 'Food glorious food' and 'Family and friends'. In these topics, the children will be learning how to say and order different foods.
