

Class 1- Year 1

ENGLISH

This term we will be exploring the texts *Dear Mother Goose* by Michael Rosen and *Little Red Riding Hood*.

As part of the *Dear Mother Goose* unit the children will write a letter from a nursery-rhyme character and a reply from Mother Goose. They will design an appropriate format for their letter and use punctuation correctly, including question marks and exclamation marks.

As part of the *Little Red Riding Hood* unit the children will write their own version of *Little Red Riding Hood*. They will join words and sentences using 'and'. They will begin to punctuate their sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.




MATHEMATICS

This term we will develop our understanding of

Addition and Subtraction:

- Number bonds to 10
- Compare number bonds
- Addition - adding together/adding more/using bonds
- Subtraction - taking away, how many left?
- Introducing the subtraction symbol/ counting back/ finding the difference/ comparing addition and subtraction statements



Place Value:

- Count forwards and backwards and write numbers to 20 in numerals and words
- Numbers from 11 to 20
- Tens and ones
- Count one more and one less
- Compare groups of objects
- Compare numbers
- Order groups of objects
- Order numbers

Geometry:

- Recognise and name 3-D shapes
- Recognise and name 2-D shapes
- Sort 3-D shapes
- Sort 2-D shapes
- Patterns with 3-D and 2-D shapes

SCIENCE

Our topic for this term is *Everyday Materials*. The children will:

- Explore different materials and sort them into groups before writing songs based on their properties



HISTORY

Our topic for this term is *All About Me!* The children will:

- Show an understanding of how their childhood is different and similar to those of their grandparents

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider what it would be like if the tables were made of jelly or the chairs were chocolate • Recreate the story of The Three Little Pigs and predict what will happen to their houses 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Show an understanding of the stages of development and changes they have been through since birth • Discuss their place within their family history • Use images and artefacts from childhood to discuss similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods
<p>COMPUTING Our computing unit this term is Digital Painting. The children will:</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make marks on a screen and explain which tools they used • Draw lines on a screen and explain which tools they used • Use the paint tools to draw a picture • Use the shape tool and the line tools • Make marks with the square and line tools • Use the shape and line tools effectively • Use the shape and line tools to recreate the work of an artist • Use a computer on their own to paint a picture • Make dots of colour on the page • Change the colour and brush sizes • Use dots of colour to create a picture in the style of an artist on their own 	<p>DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY Our unit this term is Preparing Fruit and Vegetables.</p>  <p>The children will be challenged to design, make and evaluate a fruit and vegetable kebab for themselves and their peers to eat as a snack at the class Christmas party. As part of the unit the children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe textures • Wash hands and clean surfaces • Think of interesting ways to decorate food • Say where some foods come from, (i.e. plant or animal) • Describe differences between some food groups • Discuss how fruit and vegetables are healthy • Cut, peel and grate safely and hygienically with support
<p>RE Our RE unit this term is What do Christians believe God is like?</p>  <p>The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify what a parable is • Tell the story of the Lost Son from the Bible simply, and recognise a link with the concept of God as a forgiving Father • Give clear, simple accounts of what the story means to Christians 	<p>PSHE We will be using Jigsaw for PSHE. This term our topic is Celebrating Difference. The children will :</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify similarities between people in their class • Identify differences between people in their class • Be able to say what bullying is • Identify people who they could talk to if they were feeling unhappy or being bullied • Know how to make new friends

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give at least two examples of a way in which Christians show their belief in God as loving and forgiving • Tell the key points of the story of Jonah from the Bible, and recognise a link with the concept of God • Give an example of a way in which Christians use the story of Jonah to guide their beliefs about God 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be able to say some ways they are different from their friends
<p>PE This term our PE units are Dance and Hit Catch Run!</p>  <p>Dance- the children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Respond to a range of stimuli and types of music • Explore space, direction, levels and speed • Experiment creating actions and performing movements with different body parts • <p>Hit Catch Run- the children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hit objects with a hand or bat • Track and retrieve a rolling ball • Throw and catch a variety of balls and objects <p>PE day- Wednesday</p>	<p>HOME LEARNING The focus of our home learning is reading at home.
