




# Parent Curriculum Overview

Summer Term 2021 Class 1- Year 1

# **ENGLISH**

This term we will be exploring the texts ' The Train Ride by June Crebbin, Naughty Bus by Jan and Jerry Oke, A First Book of the Sea



by Nicola Davies and Mrs Armitage and the Big Wave by Quentin Blake. The children will continue to work on: punctuating sentences using a capital letter and question mark; using a capital letter for the personal pronoun I; saying out loud what they are going to write about; composing a sentence orally before writing it; sequencing sentences to form short narratives and rereading what they have written to check it makes sense.

# MATHEMATICS

This term we will develop our understanding of multiplication and division by:

- Counting in 2s
- Counting in 5s
- Counting in 10s
- Making equal groups
- Adding equal groups
- Making arrays
- Making doubles
- Making equal groups- grouping
- Making equal groups- sharing

We will develop our understanding of fractions by:

- Finding a half
- Finding a quarter

## SCIENCE

Our topic for this term is 'Plants'. In this unit the children will: identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees; identify



and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

# **HISTORY**

This term our History topic asks the question- 'Who was Mary Anning and what makes her significant in history and now?



' During the topic we will explore the following questions:

- Who was Mary Anning? When and where did she live?
  What makes her significant in history and now?
- What did Mary do in her life that was so special?
- Which other people were important in Mary's life and why?
- How do we know about Mary's actions which happened so long ago?

The children will:

- Use vocabulary such as then/now, past/present to show where the significant people fit in history.
- Begin to understand how history affects our lives today.


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# COMPUTING


Our computing unit this term is 'Digital Painting'. The children will:



- Use the paint tools to draw a picture
- Use the shape and line tools to recreate the work of an artist
- Make appropriate colour choices
- Create a picture in the style of an artist

### ART

In Art this term we will be looking at sculpture and 3D Art using clay. We will be studying the art work of Christy Keeney who is a ceramicist. The children will:



- Use a variety of techniques such as rolling and moulding
- Use a variety of shapes
- Use key vocabulary to demonstrate knowledge and understanding: model, sculpture, art, and statue
- Use their sketchbook to record their ideas, observations and reflections.

This term our PE units are Hit Catch Run and Run, Jump
