We have had a week using the 'soft start' to the school day and it has been great to hear so many positive responses from parents. I have enjoyed seeing parents feeling comfortable in school and hope this continues. As with anything new, there are going to be a few teething







problems and your feedback on this has helped. After talking things through with staff, we are going to make a few small 'tweaks' for next week. Hopefully this will make things run even more smoothly.

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Morning Routine

- All KSI and Reception children to come in through the KSI playground door from 8:45am (not classroom doors) this will mean there is less back and forth through classrooms.
- All KS2 children to come in through the double doors next to the hall. Parents can come in if they wish or pass a message to the staff member on the door.
- There will be a staff member on both the KSI and KS2 doors until 8:55am when they will close the doors. Parents should have left by this time.
- The front and back gates will be closed at 8:55am. This means no doors are left open unsupervised by a member of staff. **Please do not prop open the front gate** this will stop it locking automatically at 8:55am.

Afternoon Routine

- Reception will leave through their classroom outside door please wait down by the Reception classroom door.
- Year I will leave through their classroom outside door please wait down by the Year I classroom door.
- Year 2 will leave through the KSI playground door please wait on the playground.
- Years 3, 4, 5, and 6 will leave through the double doors by the hall.
- All children who are being picked up will not be handed over until their adult has been seen by the class teacher.

At least one of Jess Alford, Rosina Kellman or myself will be around each morning and afternoon to say hello. We will be on different doors on different days so look out for us if you need any help.

Parking outside school

Parents have raised concerns about the number of cars parking directly outside school on the zig-zag lines and around the corner on the double yellow lines. This is at the start and end of the school day. While parking is difficult near to school, please avoid the area directly outside. It makes it more difficult for children to cross the road safely as they are unable to see cars coming without standing in the road.

Head Lice

We have had a few cases of head lice in school. Please check your child's hair for these pesky little critters and treat if necessary. Children shouldn't need to stay off school but please tie up long hair to discourage their spread.
