Free School Meals

Please get in touch if your circumstances have changed and you think your child may be eligible for Free School Meals. Applying now would mean that your child receives Free School Meals until the end of primary school even if your circumstances change. In addition, in the event of another lockdown, food vouchers may be available again.

A child may be eligible for free school meals (FSM) if their parents receive any of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided the parents are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax credit
- Universal Credit for those applying on or after 1 April 2018, their household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits they get). See section below for protections in place for those affected by the introduction of this income threshold

There have been no further reports of positive Covid-19 cases at Buckfastleigh Primary School since the one reported earlier in the week.
