School Games Gold Award

I need to announce that this year, the school been recognised for it's work in developing fit and healthy children by receiving the School Games Gold Award. This is a national award linked to sport that Dan Wase has led on this year. It can only be achieved if there are lots of opportunities for the children to participate in physical activity and sport. This year, these have included:

- Providing a broad curriculum in Physical Education across all Year Groups.
- Designed a new curriculum focussing on motor competence, rules, strategies and tactics and healthy participation.
- Attending and running a combined total of 35 events.
- Initiating our young Play Leaders programme which will see huge development next year.
- Investing in technology and equipment to enhance lesson content for all year groups.
- Utilising coaching from a range of providers to promote excellent practice.
- Providing 9 different sports clubs over the academic year.
- Swimming safety lessons to all pupils in Years 1-6.

With a huge amount of young people competing in local inter-school competitions this year, we are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible.
