South Dartmoor School Sports Partnership	£3995	<p>Last year as a result of being a part of the partnership the following percentages of children participated in at least one sporting event or competition:</p> <p>Foundation: 38% Year One: 100% Year Two: 69% Year Three: 94% Year Four: 85% Year Five: 80% Year Six: 100%</p> <p>As well as providing a great deal of sporting opportunities for our pupils ranging from football to dance, the South Dartmoor School Sports Partnership offers a substantial amount of support to the PE co-ordinator providing guidance and mentoring. Regular PLT meetings encourage the sharing of good practise across the entire partnership and training of staff is included in the price.</p>
Coach Travel to and from Events	£982	<p>The children talked with enthusiasm about their experiences both during the events and after. The children were seen to apply the skills they had picked up in friendly competitions into their PE lessons.</p> <p>In more competitive tournaments, the children were able to represent the team and engage in competitive sport all around Devon. Without the money to support travel for large amounts of pupils, this would not have been at all possible.</p>
PE scheme	£449	<p>The scheme purchased offers a differentiated and easy to follow sequence of lessons to enable teachers to deliver high quality PE teaching and learning.</p> <p>The scheme enables ALL teachers to follow it whilst challenging the most able pupils in a year group and supporting the least able thus enabling all children to make good progress in PE lessons.</p>
Equipment	£1,517	<p>A range of equipment was purchased to support active playtimes in KS1 and to support PE lessons and clubs. This equipment allowed the children to keep active throughout the day whilst also allowing PE lessons to be enjoyable, well-resourced and fulfilling. This cost also</p>

		included resources to support our tag rugby unit.
Clubs	£1,110	Building links with Torquay United, we created a lunchtime club on Wednesday's to help support active lunch times and to keep the children moving. The children were seen to be enjoying their lunchtime a lot more with a range of different activities and using a range of different resources. The cost also includes an after school football club run by Torquay United which includes a wide range of different ability children including those that are Pupil Premium and SEN.
Staff Training	£565	Allowed staff to become more confident in delivering quality PE learning and more confident in their abilities to deliver good to outstanding after school clubs. As well as this we received some inspire coaching from South Dartmoor. Also includes training for PE co-ordinator through the School Schools Partnership conference.

Overview

This year the Sports Premium money has risen from £8,000 plus £5 per pupil to £16,000 plus £10 per pupil. This means that at Buckfastleigh Primary School we are line to receive around **£18,000**. This is in large part funded by the recent Sugar Tax.

The DFE provides very clear guidelines as to what the money can and cannot be used for on its website:

“Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- *develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers*
- *make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years*

For example, you can use your funding to:

- *hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers*
- *provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively*

- *introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport*
- *support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs*
- *run sport competitions*
- *increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)*
- *run sports activities with other schools*

You should not use your funding to:

- *employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets*
- *teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum)''*

The DFE give local authorities PE and sport premium funding in two separate payments. We receive:

- 7/12 of our funding allocation in late October/early November (roughly £10,500)
- 5/12 of our funding allocation in late April/early May (roughly £7,500)

Suggested priorities for this funding.

- 1) *The teaching and learning of PE at Buckfastleigh Primary School. In particular, consistency across all year groups so that there is a clear progression throughout the child's life in Primary School.*

Providing a greater amount of resources across the PE curriculum (Dance, Gymnastics included) to excite and engage teachers and learners.	Medium	Medium
Invest in additional training for class teachers and TA's tailored to any concerns the class teacher has teaching a particular strand of PE.	Low	Medium
Consistently monitor PE in the school through PE learning walks. Pay for release time for PE Co-Ordinator to get a feel for current PE lessons throughout the school and see where the money should be best spent.	Low	Medium
Employ a 'PE apprentice' to support PE lessons throughout the school allowing for more differentiation and challenge and give teachers support in PE lessons.	High	High
Invest in the hall as an active space. Upgrade equipment such as ropes and mats. Look into upgrading the floor in the hall.	High	Medium

- 2) *Providing children with many opportunities to participate in active extra-curricular activities through:*
- i) *Lunchtime or after school clubs*
 - ii) *Competitions with other schools through the SSP*
 - iii) *Friendly sporting events with other schools through the SSP*

Suggested Budget Allocation: £7000

<u>Suggested use of funding to support priority</u>	<u>Cost</u>	<u>Potential Impact</u>
Further extend our link with Torquay United to provide additional after school and lunchtime active clubs for our children.	Medium	High
Provide staff an incentive for helping at competitions and events after school by offering them a day or half a day in lieu if they assist in a certain amount of events. (eg: 3 events = half a day in lieu).	Low	High
Pay support staff for running a PE related after school or lunchtime club and provide the resources and planning they need to run it effectively through the PE funding.	Medium	Medium
Employ a 'PE apprentice' to be a named adult on events to ease the pressure on class teachers and teaching assistants to attend. The PE apprentice could also run an extra- curricular club.	High	Medium
Develop a pupil run 'PE council' to engage and motivate pupils to participate in the after school clubs on offer and act as a pupil voice for which PE clubs children wish to participate in school.	Low	Medium
Look into the possibility of investing in half term and holiday clubs run by outside agencies at Buckfastleigh.	Medium	High
Develop links with a range of sporting clubs throughout Devon such as Plymouth Football Club and Exeter Chiefs to create both after school clubs and memorable sporting experiences for the children.	Medium-High	High
Build links outside of the SSP on a local level, hire out Ducks Pond on a more regular basis and invite schools to play sports with us at a local and competitive level. Maybe have a theme for each term.	Low-Medium	High
<i>Side note: Investing in a mini bus – it may be economically viable to invest in a minibus depending on how much money we have spent on transport going to events in previous years.</i>	<i>High</i>	<i>TBC</i>

- 3) *Providing children with daily consistent physical activity through playtimes, lunchtimes, wet plays and at home.*

Build a greater link with Torquay United to provide quality after school and lunchtime clubs.	Medium	High
Buy resources to support active wet play such as table top games.	Low	Medium
Invest in the KS2 playground to make it a more active space – dedicated playtime resources such as basketball hoops, upgrade football goals.	High	High
Invest in a greater range of equipment for KS1 playground to suit all children including SEN.	Low	High
Build links with home by introducing active clubs in early years that parents can join in with (Family Funs as an example)	Medium-High	High
Invest in holiday active clubs at Buckfastleigh Primary School run by outside agencies.	High	High
Have 'Active family days' at Ducks Pond where parents, children and teachers can play together with school equipment.	Medium	High
Invest in more high intensity equipment such as rowing machines, exercise bikes and cross trainers for daily vigorous activity.	High	High
